She highlighted the landmark SAMPADA survey's vital contributions and the impact of Dietary Guidelines in tackling obesity and NCDs reflecting the Institute's national leadership in shaping public health solutions for India and beyond.

During a special side event as part of the World Health Assembly 2025, Indian Council of Medical Research showcased its pioneering work in advancing evidencebased strategies for NCD prevention and control. The event
